As with every year many things have been achieved. We have participated in a wide range of sporting activities including swimming, netball, NRL, ARL, ballgames, athletics, cricket and Zumba. Dianne has been instrumental in this.

Students on the whole performed well in the NAPLAN tests. We introduced the Understanding Words program to support reading difficulties and the results are very positive. Students have been loving learning in Vicki's room, using a differentiated curriculum style that is celebrated by Southern Cross University. Students particularly in the Infants grade are loving reading, reflected by their love of borrowing from the library.

We have upgraded many old struggling computers and consequently were able to be linked to a central server to allow upgrades and maintenance to be performed externally, thus reducing 'down time'. It has made using technology in the classroom far more effective and students have produced some very good work. They are also able to access excellent interactive sites.

We have participated in many cultural activities including video conferences, student leadership days, visits to plays and the Art Gallery and performances at other schools including a visit to Carool to celebrate NAIDOC. Our many and varied excursions away from school are due to the fantastic Friday lunch volunteers and the donations from this fundraiser by the P & C.

Our Multi Cultural Day is always special and was attended by 45 TAFE students from six different countries.

We were successful in receiving a Solar Schools Grant and we now have solar panels working away for us, hopefully reducing our electricity bill.

I would like to wish the Year 6 students a wonderful transition to high school and everyone a happy and safe holiday period.


