SPINAL INJURIES VISIT

Daniel from Spinal Education Awareness Team (SEAT), visited Duranbah PS on Wednesday. The visit was very informative giving the students a new awareness about spinal cord injuries and an understanding that spinal injuries do not stop people from leading full and enjoyable lives. We have printed below some K-2 student quotes about the visit and information which they think is important.

- 'Always wear a helmet when riding a pushbike.' Nate
- 'Always swim between the Red and Yellow flags when at the beach.' Alex
- 'Always walk into the water to check how deep it is before diving in.' Logan
- 'When possible always protect your spine, always watch were you are diving because there could be rocks just under the water and you may break your back and be in a wheel chair for the rest of your life.' Chyna
- 'I found interesting that the back bone is all split up in parts and if you break it you can't use your legs and hands. I found it amazing that you can still go in races, do 100m in 10 seconds in a wheel chair and win a medal or two, play basketball and go to the Special Olympics even if you have a broken back.' - 'It was a great talk. Daniel's personal story was really interesting because he was funny. The Jack and Ella story told us all about spinal injuries and the different wheel chairs for people with different spinal injuries. He also told us how dangerous it is to swing on our chairs at school.' Nat
