Zucchini Muffins

Ingredients

- 2 zucchinis, grated & liquid squeezed out
- 1 carrot, grated
- 125g tin corn kernels, drained
- 1 small red onion, finely diced
- 1 cup baby spinach leaves, chopped
- 1 cup wholemeal self-raising flour
- 6 eggs, beaten
- 1 cup reduced-fat tasty cheese, grated

Method

1. Preheat oven to 180oC. Line a 12-hole muffin tin with muffin liners.
2. Heat a non-stick frypan over medium heat and cook the onion until translucent. Allow to cool.
3. Place all ingredients into a large mixing bowl and mix until well combined.
4. Divide the mixture between the 12 muffin liners. Bake for 25 to 30 minutes or until muffins are golden and a skewer comes out clean.
