Recipe

Banana Muffins

Ingredients 1 cup yoghurt 1 cup rolled oats 1 egg 1/2 cup vegetable oil 1/4 cup sugar 3/4 cup mashed banana 1 1/4 cup self raising flour Optional – add some sult



Optional – add some sultanas or dates

Method

Preheat oven to 220 degrees. Combine yoghurt and oats. Put into fridge for 30 mins – no more, no less! Add remaining ingredients in this order – egg, oil, sugar, banana, flour and mix gently. Spoon mixture into a 12 hole muffin tray lined with baking paper and bake for 15-20min.
