YOUNG TALENT SHOW

Congratulations to those students who performed at the inaugural 15 Minutes of Fame concert for young musical artists at Stokers Siding on July 3. Ably coached and supported at the event by Mr Eizenberg, they sang and played beautifully. It's not easy to get up on stage to perform, so well done to our students, we are very proud of you!















Our students returned to school this week to discover a bumper crop of produce in our gardens! The beds were brimming with spinach, lettuce, rocket and radishes. The kids have been eagerly checking the carrots, which are not quite ready, snacking on young celery and spring onions, and we can't wait to see some broccoli and cauliflower pop up their heads. This week , 2-3K harvested and bagged the greens, which were sold out at school pick-up, while K-1M and 4-5-6E together sprayed our fruit trees against pests using a white oil we made using a simple solution of cooking oil and dish detergent diluted in a little water. Let's hope it helps our trees flourish! Our chooks have been very busy laying eggs, but not always in their coop! We found 10 eggs under a tree, but our students checked each and every one for freshness in a bowl of water before they were sold. Our garden beds will need re-planting soon, so why not talk to your kids about what they would like to grow at school and perhaps bring in some seeds, seedlings or cuttings? Our bread-bag recycling drive continues so please bring in your unused bread bags and drop in the collection bins on the verandah and in the office. The program closes in the next month, so any and all bread bags will be gratefully received.





HARDSHIP FUNDING

FOR FLOOD EFFECTED FAMILIES

The Minister for Education and Early Learning announced that \$500 Education Hardship Fund will be made available for every NSW public school student in the 7 identified local government area (LGAs) affected by the recent floods in the Northern Rivers region.

The funds will be transferred to schools over the coming weeks and are to be expended by the end of 2023. Parents and carers can nominate to use funds for:

- * excursions, camps and incursions
- * school-organised formals
- * competition fees
- subject fees
- * uniforms including: school uniforms (from school-run or P&C uniform shops), end of school year jerseys, senior shirt
- * calculators
- * in-school tutoring such as music tutors
- * sport participation including weekly sport or carnivals
- * school photos
- * family costs incurred with involvement in school theatre or musical performances
- ongoing weekly co-curricular programs such as dance or gymnastics programs.

Please contact the school to advise how you would like to use your \$500. These funds cannot be given as cash payments to families.


