Principal's Report

Welcome back for 2023 to all of our returning families and a big warm welcome to our new ones. It was great to connect with all of our students and families last week and hear about all the wonderful things that happened over the break.

Surfing

Our school sport in term 1 is surfing, which starts Friday 10th February. As usual a bus will transport all students to the Kingscliff breakwall and parents can join us in the surf before bringing their kids home.

Staffing

We welcome a couple of new staff to our school in 2023. Mrs Sharon Barbour is our new School Psychologist who is at our school each Thursday morning. Families who wish to access this service can simply get a referral from the office. Mrs Melinda Lengyel joins us in the role of Assistant Principal, Curriculum and Instruction for at least Term 1. She will continue the fine work of Mrs Eadsforth, to ensure our staff and our learning programs are current and best-practice.

New Bus Pick-up

In an exciting addition, Cheryl and J&B buses have organised an extra pickup and dropoff spot that may help many of our families and in the process, ease some of the congestion in our school, particularly in the afternoons. The new spot is at the Shoebridge Transport carpark (beside the 'fruit-ute'), which is on the corner of Cudgen Rd and Plantation Rd. Pick-up in the mornings will be at approx. 8:15 am and in the afternoon, the pick-ups will be at approx. 2:50 pm.

Students will require a bus pass (see attached information), however J&B will allow transport immediately, before the passes have arrived. As always, please ensure your child is aware of all travel arrangements.

I'd encourage any families who are able to utilise this option to consider this, as it will have a number of positives, including reducing the travel required by families.

Music Lessons

Music lessons begin in earnest this week. Both Mr Eizenberg and Mr Smith provided free 'tasters' last week to all students who felt they might like to try an instrument. Students who would like to learn an instrument can simply ask for a permission note at the front office. Unless told otherwise, we will simply schedule all 2022 students into the same lessons. STUDENT ATTENDANCE

The NSW Department of Education requirements for student absences both Whole Days and Part Days are as follows:

- Whole Day Absences must be in writing (e.g. note from parent/caregiver, email). Phone calls will be taken, but must be followed by a note.
- Part Day Absences Late or slept in are no longer justified reasons for being late to school. They will be recorded as Explained but Unjustified.
- Any students who arrive late, after 9.00 am, must either have a note or be accompanied by a parent and be signed in at the office.
- Any student who is away for more than two days without explanation can receive a phone call from the school
- Student absences MUST be explained within 7 days. Upon your child's return to school, please send in a note or use Flexischools to notify us of the reason for the absence. A Medical Certificate must be supplied for all medical absences (i.e. sick days) over 2 days.

Our fortnightly School Newsletter is being modernised and it will be published on Tuesdays this term. This Newsletter is printed and then published on our School Website, on our School and Community Facebook Page and on the Flexischool App.

COVID-19 PROCEDURES 2023

While the community continues to transition towards living with COVID-19, NSW Health advise that the unpredictable nature of the virus will continue to present a health risk to the community, with new waves of transmission expected in 2023.

In line with the health advice and community settings, the department will continue implementing baseline COVID-smart measures in schools throughout Term 1. These include:

- Reminding students, staff and families to stay home if unwell and test for COVID-19 if showing any symptoms
- Boosted day cleaning of high touch areas in our schools
- Strongly encouraging masks to be worn by all students, staff and visitors, particularly when indoors or outdoors when physical distancing is difficult to maintain.
- Requiring masks for staff and volunteers who interact with students at greater risk of serious illness if they were to contract
- -COVID-19 including in SSPs, support units and some mainstream settings
- -Strongly encouraging up-to-date vaccinations for our staff and students, including COVID-19 booster shots for anyone eligible
- -Maintaining natural ventilation with windows and doors open whenever possible, including when cooling/heating systems are in use
- -Continuing to provide RATs and other hygiene products to schools through EdBuy, free of charge.

SURFING (All students)

Our Surfing Program now begins next Friday 10 February, each Friday for 6 weeks, concluding on 17 March, 2023. The permission note was sent home with students who are the eldest in the family. Please complete the permission slip to advise us of your child/ren's transport requirements and return it to us, with payment, by Wednesday 8 February. The online in2Surf Participant Indemnity Declaration also needs to be completed for each child. All year levels are required to participate.

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STATEMENTS OF ACCOUNT

Family Statements of Financial Account will be sent home next week. These statements contain the cost of school fees, music and surfing programs. Payment may be made using any of the following methods: Cash, EFTPOS, POP, Flood Hardship Funds (if available) or NSW Service Back to School Vouchers. Prompt payment will be appreciated.

The current Book Club catalogues (Issue 1) are being sent home this week. Please place all orders online if possible. All orders are delivered to the school and distributed by us. Each purchase by our families attracts reward points, which our school uses to purchase award books for our students for the schools Presentation Ceremony at the end of the year.

ADMINISTERING MEDICATION TO STUDENTS

When a medical practitioner has prescribed medication that must be administered during the school day, parents/carers must:

-notify the school

-provide up to date information as required

-supply the medication and any

'consumables' necessary for its

administration in a timely way.

Parents/carers of children who require

prescribed medication to be administered at school must complete a written request. All medication must be in it's original container and labelled with the student's name, dosage, name of medication. Students must not carry medications unless there is a written agreement between the school and the student's parents/carers.

Non-prescribed medications:

Schools generally don't administer medication that hasn't been requested for an individual student's specific condition. In some cases the medical practitioner may not write a prescription for such medication because it may be available over the counter'. NSW Health advises that 'over the counter' medication may still be harmful and that schools should follow the same procedures for non-prescribed medications as for prescribed medications.

BUSES

Families who would like the option of their children catching the bus from the Cudgen Road and Plantation Road intersection, will need to simply attain a bus pass (no cost) and can travel from tomorrow before the pass even arrives. Just let the school know.

If you have difficulty selecting J & B Buses for your area, just contact the school and we'll send a manual form home to complete and return to school, which can then be entered by the Bus Company staff.

How to apply for a bus pass for the first time:

Step 1

Once you have enrolled your child at the new school, apply online by giving your home address and telling us which bus company the student needs to travel with between home and school. You can apply online at apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/home#/ howToApply

Step 2

The school then confirms to us that your details are correct.

Step 3

We will then work on your application. You will get an email confirming if the student is approved for free travel. If so, we will tell your local bus company who may send a school travel pass (if needed) to your school or, in some cases, the bus company will contact you directly about travel arrangements.

A parent or guardian must apply for students aged 15 years and under. Students who are 16 years and over must apply for themselves.

WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK

The Department of Education require that all volunteers who are parents or close relatives of a child at the school at which they are volunteering complete a Working With Children Check Declaration (available from the school office) and provide 100 points of identification as stated on the Service NSW website. Parents an close relatives of a child do not need a WWCC clearance number. If you come into the school to volunteer or help with day to day reading, canteen he;p, driving you need to apply.

flexischools

Receive school notifications, including Absences, Newsletters, Notes & Events and order lunches with Flexischools.

Only use the ordering and payments sections for ordering lunches and P&C Payments. Please do not use this Flexischools for any other school payments, as the funds will go to the P&C account NOT the school account.

2. Add your School and Group

Click on the search icon, enter your school name, select your school and year group, or groups relevant to you.

- New Flexischools user Click 'Register', enter your email address and follow the instructions in the email to set up your account. Once your account is set up, add new student; search for our school, enter student details and select their class.
